Administrative Report

Brad Dersch:

- Pivot point deadline to make a choice switch from Online to In-person classes, and vice versa, was as last week. - Parent Teacher Interview. Lakie did things a little different than other school in terms of parent teacher interview. It was more of a hybrid model where in-person or online interviews were offered to parents.

Raj Mathur:

- Fundraising. Fundraising was very successful considering the COVID situation and the parameters needing to be followed. The school will be spending some of the funds raised on activities for students this year while also putting money away for a larger outdoor project.
- Extra-Circular. No changes at this time. There has been dialogue between middle schools to determine how we can safely proceed moving forward.
