 - **i.** Brad Dersch:
 - December 18th is last day before the break. The Province announced this evening, shortly before this meeting, that Grades 7-12 will commence online learning starting next week, November 28, 2020. Classes are currently scheduled to return to in-person learning on January 11, 2021, unless the Province directs otherwise.
