Levelled Reading Program – Tavis Newman & Courtney Whelage

Grade 6 & 7 teams of teachers are going to deliver this program, at minimum every 2 weeks and/or weekly. The program officially started the week of November 16/15.

The program is by Fountas & Pinnell Literacy Program. This works for students who are below as well as above reading grade levels. This program has reading materials that are engaging to students and is supplementary to the Language Arts Program at GS Lakie. The kids are taught in small groups with engaging leveled books.

All students in Grades 6 & 7 are involved working with the greatest focus on children who are below reading grade levels. The program has a 26 point gradient reading program with the students all starting at a baseline. There are kits for all levels that overlap allowing the students to benefit from any of the kit levels. The kits have great outlines lessons and lots of activities to help students along the way. There are individualized lessons as well to help the kids with word work, fluency and comprehension.
